RULES:

1. Exhibitor may bring own box, 18" x 24" x 4", painted white.
2. Exhibitor determines number per vegetable that make an attractive display.
Potatoes may be included.

DIVISION B – Fruit

RULES:

1. Include the variety name on a 3" x 5" note card with entry.

DIVISION C – Crops

RULES:

1. All entries must be from current season's crop (except field corn and soybeans).
2. All sheaf entries must have a 3-inch diameter middle band.
3. SUNFLOWERS ONLY: Tips for preparation- Cover head with netting to protect from birds. Cut 2 foot stem and when dry, trim to the 6-8" depending on the tilt of the seed head. Leave on cross blossoms and dried leaves around edge. Tame should have uniform and plump seeds, should not have missing seeds, insect or bird damage, or cobwebs.
